I have taken some time to review the responses. Firstly, I'm really grateful to those folk who gave up their time to go online and offer their thoughts. Not for the first time in a survey, I'm humbled at some of the comments and outcomes. Every single parent/carer who responded, for example, would recommend this school to another parent. Wow!

Therefore, I am hoping that the teacher conversations were positive and might improve this rating a little. In terms of the extended day, that's really split opinion. Next week, I'm meeting with various groups of children to take their views directly. We're listening carefully, and will keep parents abreast of any changes if that becomes necessary! In the meantime, please do be rest assured that we are giving the children appropriate breaks in school, especially in the afternoon and especially for the younger children.
