Keeping Children Safe - Covid

As I'm sure parents are aware, covid has finally made it into Hillfort. Once in, it can spread all too quickly. We have confirmed cases in several year groups, and a couple of staff colleagues with it. We have increased our protocols around this, and reserve the right to add more as time goes on. I would suggest that it might be wise to test your children using lateral flow devices on a regular basis as actually some of the cases that have been confirmed are asymptomatic. That is to say, some of the confirmed cases had no symptoms at all! Please be assured that we will continue to review the current situation on a daily basis.



Keeping Children Safe – Sexual Abuse

Parents and carers have an incredibly important role to play in supporting children to stay safe. Some of the topics, however, can be deeply unpleasant and upsetting. It seems so early to be discussing such awful issues with young children and it can be difficult to know which words to use. Please ensure you have your activation letter for Parentpay and this has been activated by Friday 22nd October. You will need to book your child's lunch in advance or ensure your child brings a packed lunch to school. If your child is in KS1 or Free School Meals, booking is still required. Menu choices will be at point of booking for your child to choose their lunch for the week. Please note, if you have any debt outstanding on your lunch account, this will need to be paid when booking for the first time.
