Uniform

As I first communicated in February the school uniform would be changing, to align with the new government guidance around financial cost for parents.

Year 1

Initially, they sorted the coins from the greatest to smallest value and vice versa and then they started to find the correct amounts to 'buy' objects. The greatest challenge so far is that the children want to use 3p and 4p coins. Obviously, they are having to make these amounts using 1p and 2p coins.

We then used our knowledge of wind dispersed seeds to design our very own! As we are coming to the end of our Ancient Egypt topic in History, we are looking at our next and final school trip of the year. As soon as details are finalized we will get them to you as soon as possible!

We have finished the week off (well almost) with our school disco on Thursday afternoon. It was lovely to see the children enjoying themselves after working so hard all half term!
